Background

- ✘ Comprehensive PMTCT service started in Nepal in February 2005.
- ✘ There are 98 sites from where HIV testing and counseling services are available to pregnant women.
- ✘ Community-based PMTCT (CB-PMTCT) program is expanded in 16 districts where HIV screening and counseling is done among ANC visitors. -Achham, Arghakhanchi, Baitadi, Bajhang, Banke, Bardiya, Chitwan, Dadelhdhura, Dailekh, Kailali, Kanchanpur, Kapilvastu, Nawalparasi, Rupandehi, Saptari and Sunsari.
- ✘ Free ARV drugs are available from 61 ART sites in 55 districts from where HIV-positive mothers can receive treatment.
- ✘ Early Infant Diagnosis (EID) service is available for babies born to the HIV-positive mothers.

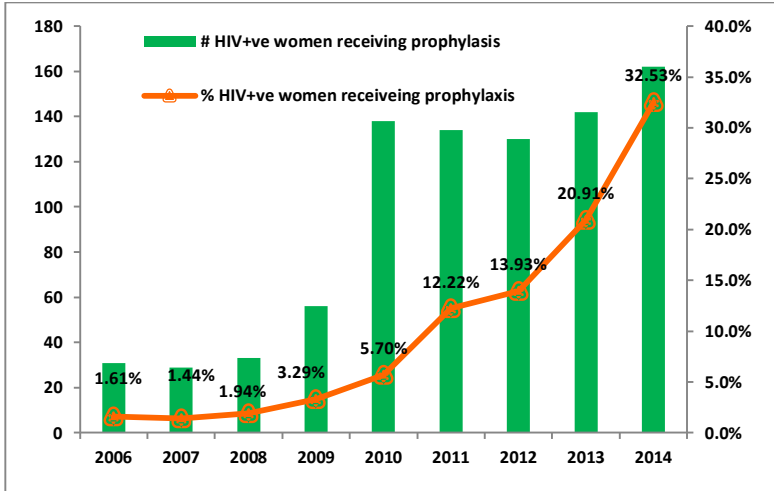

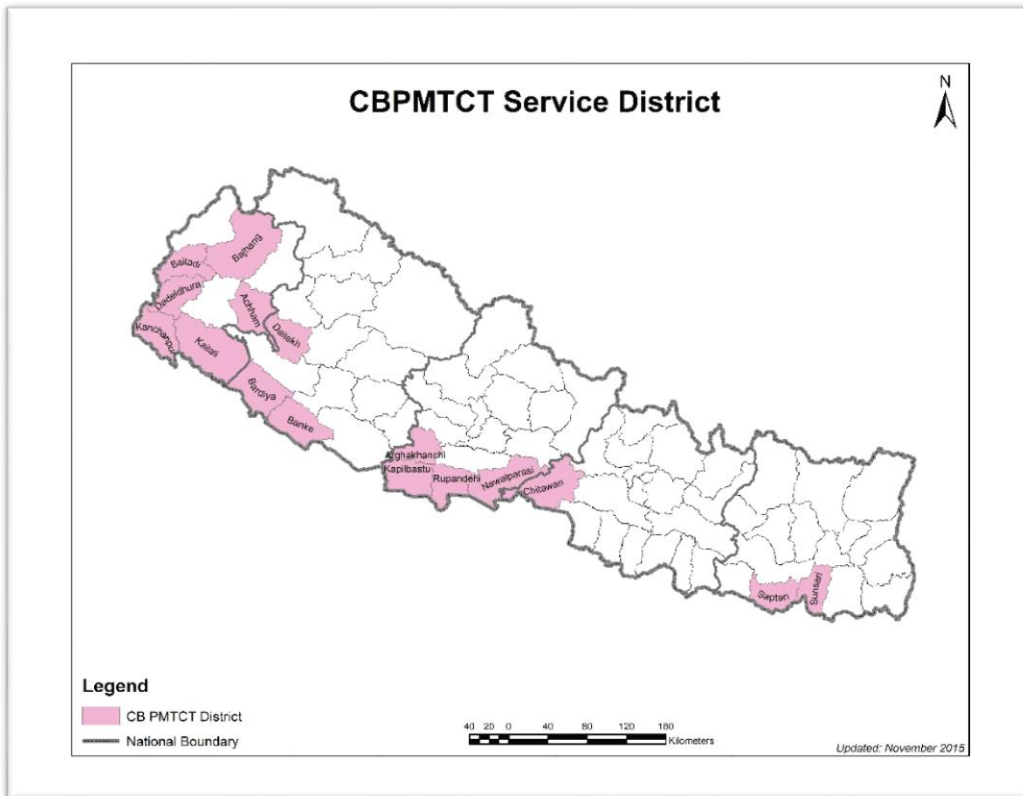
Early Infant Diagnosis:

DNA PCR test for HIV exposed babies below 18 months.

EID through DNA PCR technology is available at National Public Health Laboratory (NPHL), Teku since September 2014.

Dried blood spot (DBS) samples for EID are collected from 4 sites (NPHL, Bharatpur Hospital, Lumbini Zonal Hospital and Western Regional Hospital) with support from NPHL.

DBS are also collected from 5 sites namely Achham District Hospital, Seti Zonal Hospital, NSARC-Banke, NNSWA-Kanchanpur and SACTS-Kathmandu with support from Saath-Saath project since 2009.





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
